The Peter Kiewit Institute's College of Information Science and Technology (IS&T) is an interdisciplinary college focusing on meeting the needs of a vibrant metropolitan area. Building on Nebraska's strengths in information technology, telecommunications and construction engineering, The Peter Kiewit Institute (PKI) has charted a new course in business and education partnerships.
